


Georgia Grade 4 Mathematics

Average scale scores










L4GA Funded AGAIN!

- \$180 M over five years
- 95% Sub-granted to local education agencies and their partners
- Priority given to LEAs w/ poverty, identified schools, and low achievement, high literacy growth over 2-3 years, and rural communities
- Possible P-20 partnership efforts:
 - Induction and mentoring support
 - Field-based and/or service learning courses
 - Recruitment and retention support
 - Research-practitioner partnerships
